Prisons that serve vegan meals report calmer populations and major savings. [A jail in the U.S.](#) reported a cost reduction of over 1.1 million MYR when it switched to all-vegetarian food for its inmates, who thrived eating fresh, quality food. Vegan menus also slash healthcare costs, since animal-free foods protect against diet-related diseases.
